

LIFEGUARDS - Responsibilities of a lifeguard include protecting the lives of others as well as his/her own. Prevent injuries by minimizing or eliminating hazardous situations or behaviors. Insure safe and sanitary environment. Other duties include, but are not limited to:

- Enforcing facility rules and regulations and educate patrons about them, as needed.
- Recognize and respond effectively to all emergencies. This may mean using CPR, first aid, oxygen or an automated external defibrillator, if needed and only if trained.
- Work with other lifeguards or staff when you need more help or equipment.
- Possess and maintain current American Red Cross Lifeguard certification, CPR and First Aid.
- Able to observe swimmers for safety and sit for prolonged periods of time.
- Ability to react quickly and calmly in emergency situations.
- Able to exercise tact and diplomacy when interacting with the public.
- Ability to perform janitorial duties required to ensure a safe and sanitary facility.

Requirements:

- Must** be 16 years of age or older
- Must** hold current Lifeguard Training and CPR certification
- Must** have reliable transportation to and from work
- Must** be willing to work 40 hours per week, including evenings, weekends, & holidays
